This eBook will help you quickly become a Wakelet superstar, and enhance your teaching and learning forever.



Starting off your collection

Collections are at the heart of the Wakelet platform.

Collections are groups of content from the web, arranged and organized however you want. Add your own personal content and create collections on any topic!



Click the plus button!

Simply click the big green plus button to create a collection. You can create as many as you like, and update them whenever you wish.

Title & Description

Add a title and description to let people know what your collection is about!



Cover Image

Add a cover image to make your collection look sharp! You can either upload an image from your computer, or add one from our free image library.



Layout

Choose from 5 different layouts to make your content even more engaging. You can choose from list view, grid view, media view, mood board and columns

Adding Items to your collections



Top Tip! Copy Collection

In edit collection mode, hit the gear icon in the top left and toggle the "copy collection" button. This will allow people to copy your collection – perfect for templates and assignments!

Visibility options

There are 3 different options for visibility

Public

Everyone is able to see your collection and it will appear on your public profile (Page 5)



Unlisted Only people you share your collection with will be able to see it.




Private

Only you can see your collection.




Sharing your Collection

You can share your Wakelet collection in a number of different ways!




Public Profile

This is your public profile, It's what others will see when they find you on Wakelet! Just click your profile photo to visit your profile.




Inviting Contributors
